In 2016, he was nominated by the Government of Barbados to serve as the private sector and civil society representative for CARICOM’s Council of Trade and Economic Development (COTED) on the Executive Board of the Caribbean Centre for Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency (CCREEE) where he currently serves as the alternate representative for that post.
