> Opening Remarks by Dr. DeLisle Worrell Governor, Central Bank of Barbados

I have no doubt that there are teen talent shows all around the world, but there is only one Richard Stoute Teen Talent, and you will find it only in Barbados. Only here will you find this vibe, and this energy.

Let me therefore conclude by saying thanks to Richard for offering me the opportunity to pay tribute to his wonderful contribution to the building of our nation. All Barbadians are deeply in his debt, and especially those whose talents the competition has uncovered. Together we celebrate these past successes, and we look forward to another enjoyable season.
