S. Michael McLaughlin was born, grew up and educated in Jamaica. He was high school valedictorian and Jamaica Scholar in 1967. After graduating from UWI with his B.Sc. in Physics, he worked in computer programming.

Later moving to The Bahamas, he qualified professionally as an actuary. He moved to Dallas, Texas, working in insurance companies then with consulting firms. Mike was a consulting partner with Ernst & Young and Deloitte LLP in Chicago, and served as Executive VP & Chief Actuary of AXA Financial, in New York. Mike was President of the Society of Actuaries 2009-2010 and a member of the Executive Committee of the International Actuarial

Association. He won the SOA Prize for papers published in 1987. He co-authored the textbook *US GAAP* for Life Insurers. He served on the boards of the Academy of Actuaries, DePaul University Business School and OneAmerica Financial.

Now semi-retired, Mike is co-founder and volunteer Secretary-Treasurer of Trees That Feed Foundation ("TTFF"), whose mission is planting fruit trees in developing countries to feed people, create jobs, and benefit the environment. TTFF has supplied over 300,000 fruit trees to 20 developing countries, and aided thousands of farmers, schoolchildren, entrepreneurs, communities, organisations, and governments in the Caribbean, Central America, and Africa.
